# Prepare for Your Alopecia Treatment in Turkey



## **Documents and Visa Requirements**

- · Valid passport or travel document, with an expiration date at least 60 days beyond the duration of stay.
- For visa requirements, patients should visit the official Republic of Turkey Electronic Visa Application System (https://www.evisa.gov.tr/en/) or check with the Turkish consulate in their country.
- · Medical documents including health history, photos of the affected area, and any prior alopecia treatments.
- Clinics in Turkey offer diagnostics and tests such as female or male alopecia markers laboratory diagnostics if the patient does not have these documents.



#### **Accommodation Options**

Accommodation is not typically included in the treatment package. However, clinics may assist in booking hotel rooms at special partner prices. Average hotel stay per night ranges from \$50 to \$150. Some clinics may arrange hospital stays or recommend partner hotels with discounts. Accompanying persons are often welcome, but conditions and costs should be confirmed with the clinic.



#### **Transfer Services**

- VIP transfer services from the airport to the clinic or hotel are usually provided. However, it is important to confirm whether this service is
  free or requires an additional fee.
- Popular taxi services like BiTaksi and iTaksi operate in major Turkish cities, with approximate prices starting from \$0.50 per km.



## **Interpreter Services**

Interpreter services are available, though it's essential to verify with the clinic if there are any associated costs or if the service is included.



## **Payment Methods**

- Cash and credit card payments are widely accepted.
- The local currency is the Turkish Lira, and it is advisable to have some on hand for smaller expenses, though dollars or euros may be
  accepted in some establishments.



## **Before Your Alopecia Treatment**

- Consult with your local doctor before traveling to ensure you're fit for the procedure.
- Discuss any medications you're currently taking with the Turkish clinic as some may need to be paused or adjusted.
- · Avoid smoking and alcohol at least a week prior to treatment as they can hinder the healing process.
- Plan for a recovery period post-treatment and follow all postoperative instructions provided by your doctor.
- Ensure you have medical insurance that covers international treatment or inquire about options with the clinic.
- Prepare a list of questions or concerns to discuss with your Turkish physician before the procedure.
- Stay hydrated and maintain a balanced diet to support your overall health for a better recovery.
