## **Cyst Treatment in Spain**



#### **Documents and Visa Requirements**

- Valid passport or travel document with at least three months' validity beyond the expected return date.
- Schengen visa for stays under 90 days for non-EU residents; check the Spanish consulate website or <u>Spain Visa Information</u> for specific country requirements.
- · Medical referral letter, health insurance coverage, and previous medical reports and imaging for your Brain Cyst treatment.
- · Some clinics in Spain offer diagnostic tests if necessary medical documents are missing or outdated.



#### **Accommodation Options**

Hospital stays for the duration of the medical procedure are typically provided. Some clinics have partner hotels offering discounts, which are not usually covered by the clinic. Self-booking is also an option. The average hotel stay per night ranges from €50 to €150. Accommodation for an accompanying person can be arranged, with conditions varying by clinic.



#### **Transfer Services**

- · Clinics may offer free or paid airport transfers; it's important to confirm with the clinic beforehand.
- Popular taxi services include Taxi Barcelona and Taxi Madrid with prices starting around €30 for inner-city transfers.



#### Interpreter Services

Interpreter services are often available at Spanish clinics, either for free or at an additional cost. It's recommended to arrange this service in advance through your medical coordinator.



#### **Payment Methods**

- · Most clinics accept payment via cash or card.
- The local currency is the Euro (€), and having local cash is convenient for smaller expenses.
- · While some places may accept dollars or euros, it is advisable to exchange to the local currency for ease of transactions.



### **Before Your Brain Cyst Treatment**

- Discuss all medications you're currently taking with your medical coordinator, some may need to be stopped before the procedure.
- Arrange for someone to assist you after the procedure, as you will need rest and should not be alone.
- Prepare a bag with essentials, including loose clothing, toiletries, and any devices you might need during your hospital stay.
- Follow any fasting or preoperative instructions given by your medical team.
- Ensure you have all necessary postoperative care information and emergency contact numbers.
- Plan for transportation and accommodations post-discharge if required.
- Keep your personal medical coordinator's contact information handy for any assistance or questions during your stay.
