# Your Guide to Prepare for Breast Cancer Treatment in Germany



#### **Documents and Visa Requirements**

- Valid passport or travel document for entry into Germany.
- Specific visa requirements can be found at the German Federal Foreign Office website or by contacting the German embassy in your country.
- Medical records detailing your breast cancer diagnosis and treatment plan.
- Clinics in Germany may provide additional diagnostics and tests if certain medical documents are not available.



### **Accommodation Options**

Options for accommodation include hospital stays, partner hotels with special discounts, or self-booking. While some clinics may offer free accommodation, others do not. Average hotel stay per night can range from €50 to €150. The conditions for accompanying persons vary, and it is best to confirm with the clinic or hotel beforehand.



#### **Transfer Services**

- Some clinics in Germany offer free airport transfers, while others may charge a fee.
- Popular taxi services are available in major cities, with approximate prices starting from €30 for a one-way trip.



#### **Interpreter Services**

Interpreter services may be available at the clinic, either free of charge or for a fee. It is advisable to inquire about this service when arranging your treatment.



#### **Payment Methods**

- Payment options typically include cash and card transactions.
- The local currency is the Euro (€), and having local cash can be convenient for smaller transactions.
- In some instances, payment in dollars or euros may be accepted, but it's best to have local currency for ease of travel.



#### **Before Your Breast Cancer Treatment**

- · Consult with your local doctor about the specifics of your treatment plan and any necessary preparations.
- Ensure all your routine vaccines are up-to-date before travelling.
- Discuss with your German clinic any medications you are taking and their availability in Germany.
- Prepare a list of emergency contacts, including family, friends, and your home country's embassy.
- Consider learning basic German phrases or downloading a translation app for easier communication.
- Pack clothing appropriate for the climate and season of your travel dates.
- Arrange for travel insurance that covers international medical treatment and emergencies.
- · Remember that postoperative instructions will be provided by your breast cancer treatment doctor in Germany.
