

Your Guide to Prepare for CyberKnife Trip to Spain



Documents and Visa Requirements

- Passport with at least six months' validity from the date of entry into Spain.
- European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) for EU residents, or travel health insurance for non-EU residents.
- Visa requirements can be checked on the official website of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Spain or via <a href="https://doi.org/10.1001/jhis.2007/jh
- · Medical referral letter, medical history, and previous treatment records.
- Spanish clinics offer diagnostics and tests if patients lack certain medical documents.



Accommodation Options

Patients can choose from hospital stays, partner hotels with special rates, or self-booking options. The clinic may offer free accommodation for the patient, but additional charges may apply for companions. The average hotel stay per night ranges from €50 to €150, depending on the location and the standard of the hotel.



Transfer Services

- Clinics may offer complimentary airport transfers; otherwise, paid options are available.
- Popular taxi services include Taxi Madrid, Taxi Barcelona, with approximate prices starting from €30 for city transfers.



Interpreter Services

Interpreter services are available upon request, with costs varying by the clinic. Some clinics may offer this service for free, while others charge an additional fee.



Payment Methods

- Accepted payment options include cash and credit/debit cards.
- The local currency is the Euro (EUR), and it is recommended to have local cash for minor expenses.
- Payments in dollars or euros are widely accepted, but it is advisable to have euros for a comfortable stay.



Pre-Op CyberKnife Tips

- Discuss any current medications with your doctor as some may need to be stopped before the procedure.
- Avoid consuming alcohol and smoking at least a week before the treatment.
- Maintain a healthy diet and stay hydrated in the days leading up to the procedure.
- Plan for adequate rest and recovery time post-treatment based on your doctor's advice.
- Prepare a list of questions or concerns to discuss with your CyberKnife specialist during consultations.
- Wear comfortable clothing on the day of the procedure.
- Ensure you have someone to accompany you if necessary, as you may not be able to drive post-treatment.
