

Prepare for Your Hydrocephalus Treatment in Turkey



Documents and Visa Requirements

- Passport valid for at least 6 months from the date of entry into Turkey.
- Visa requirements vary by country. Check the latest information at [Turkey's e-Visa portal](#).
- Medical records detailing your Hydrocephalus condition, including scans and reports.
- Clinics in Turkey may provide additional diagnostics and tests if certain medical documents are not available.



Accommodation Options

Patients undergoing Hydrocephalus treatment have options for hospital stays or partner hotels at special prices. Accommodation is not typically free but may be included in treatment packages. The average hotel stay per night ranges from \$50 to \$150, and conditions for accompanying persons are usually hospitable, with some clinics providing discounted or complimentary stays.



Transfer Services

- Many clinics offer free airport transfers, while others may charge an additional fee.
- Popular taxi services such as BiTaksi and iTaksi provide rides in major cities, with an approximate cost of \$0.5-\$1 per kilometer.



Interpreter Services

Interpreter services are available, sometimes free of charge depending on the clinic. Otherwise, fees are applicable and vary based on language and duration of services required.



Payment Methods

- Most clinics accept payments via cash or credit/debit card.
- The local currency is the Turkish Lira (TRY). It's advisable to have local currency for small expenses, although many places accept dollars or euros.



Before Your Hydrocephalus Treatment

- Discuss your full medical history with your Turkish medical team prior to treatment.
- Ensure you have all necessary vaccinations as recommended by the CDC or your local health authority before traveling.
- Bring enough of your current medications to last your entire trip, as well as a copy of your prescriptions.
- Plan for a recovery period - your stay in Turkey will include 5 days in the hospital and 7 days in a hotel for postoperative care.
- Understand the risks and possible complications associated with Hydrocephalus surgery and discuss them with your surgeon.
- Wear comfortable clothing and pack items that might be needed for a hospital stay (e.g., slippers, bathrobe).
- Arrange for someone to assist you during your recovery period, if possible.
- Prepare your home for your return to ensure a comfortable and safe recovery environment.
