

# Prepare for Your Lung Cancer Treatment in Poland



## Documents and Visa Requirements

- Valid passport or travel document for entry into Poland.
- Check visa requirements and apply if necessary on the official website of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Poland or through their consulate in your country.
- Medical records detailing your lung cancer history, including biopsy results, imaging (CT scans, MRIs), and treatment records.
- Polish clinics may provide additional diagnostics and tests if certain medical documents are missing.



## Accommodation Options

Hospital stays are typically part of the treatment package. Partner hotels may offer discounted rates for extended stays post-hospitalization. Self-booking is also an option. Hospital-provided accommodation is usually free, while hotels average at about \$50-100 per night. Accompanying persons may stay with the patient or book separate accommodation.



## Transfer Services

- Clinics often provide free VIP airport transfers for patients opting for comprehensive treatment packages.
- Regular taxi services are available in major cities, with an average cost of 1.50-3.00 PLN/km (approximately \$0.35-\$0.70/km).



## Interpreter Services

Interpreter services are often available through the clinic, sometimes free of charge, depending on the treatment package. Otherwise, fees may apply, and it is recommended to arrange this service in advance through your medical coordinator.



## Payment Methods

- Payment can be made via cash or card.
- The local currency is the Polish Złoty (PLN), and it is recommended to have some for small expenses.
- Most places accept payments in PLN, but some may also accept dollars or euros.



## Before Your Lung Cancer Treatment

- Consult with your local doctor about pre-treatment care and share this information with your Polish medical team.
- Prepare a list of current medications and share it with your treatment provider in Poland.
- Plan for adequate rest and a moderate diet before traveling to avoid any unnecessary stress on your body.
- Stay hydrated and avoid alcohol, as it can affect your recovery and treatment.
- Organize your insurance documents and ensure that they cover international medical treatment.
- Pack comfortable clothing and personal items that will help you feel at ease during your stay.
- Follow any pre-treatment instructions given by your medical coordinator or clinic.
- Remember that all postoperative instructions will be provided by your lung cancer treatment doctor.
