

Prepare for Your Lymphoma Treatment in Germany



Documents and Visa Requirements

- International travel documents needed for Germany include a valid passport and a Schengen visa for most non-EU countries.
- Patients can check visa requirements based on their country of origin at the German Federal Foreign Office website or the nearest German embassy.
- Essential medical documents include medical history records, diagnosis details, and any previous treatment records.
- German clinics can provide diagnostics and tests if certain medical documents are missing, ensuring a comprehensive evaluation before treatment.



Accommodation Options

Patients undergoing Lymphoma treatment are provided with a two-bed ward during their 5-day hospital stay. Some clinics may offer partner hotels at special prices or assist in self-booking. The cost for a hotel stay per night averages 100-200 euros. Conditions for the accompanying person can vary, and it's best to confirm with the clinic.



Transfer Services

- Clinics often provide free or paid airport transfer services.
- Popular taxi services are available in major cities, with approximate prices starting from 30 euros for short distances.



Interpreter Services

Interpreter services are available, either free or for a fee, depending on the clinic's policy. It is advisable to confirm the availability and cost prior to the visit.



Payment Methods

- Payment options include cash and card transactions.
- The local currency is the euro, and it is necessary to have it for smaller transactions although major expenses can often be paid in euros or dollars.



Before Your Lymphoma Treatment

- Ensure you have all medical and travel documents organized and accessible.
- Discuss your current medications with your treatment provider in Germany to ensure compatibility.
- Plan your stay in advance, including accommodation and transportation.
- Prepare for your recovery period - consider comfortable clothing and personal care items.
- Stay informed about your treatment plan and ask questions to understand the process fully.
- Adhere to any pre-treatment instructions provided by your doctor, such as fasting or medication adjustments.
- Keep emergency contact numbers handy, including those of your medical coordinator.
