Your Guide to Prepare for Lymphoma Treatment in Turkey



Documents and Visa Requirements

- Valid passport and/or national ID as international travel documents are required for entry into Turkey.
- Visa requirements vary; patients can check the latest information based on their country of origin at the official Republic of Turkey Electronic Visa Application System at www.evisa.gov.tr/en/.
- Medical documents including diagnosis confirmation, medical history, and any previous treatment records are necessary before undergoing Lymphoma treatment.
- Should certain medical documents be lacking, clinics in Turkey can provide diagnostics and tests to establish a comprehensive medical
 profile for treatment.



Accommodation Options

Accommodation is not included in the medical procedures. Patients can expect a hospital stay of 3-7 days as part of their treatment. Clinics may have partnerships with local hotels offering discounted rates. Self-booking through various travel platforms is also an option. The average hotel stay per night in Turkey is approximately \$50-\$100. Accompanying persons may stay with the patient or arrange their accommodation separately.



Transfer Services

- Clinics may offer free or paid airport transfer services to and from the hospital.
- Popular taxi services like BiTaksi and iTaksi are available in major Turkish cities, with approximate prices ranging from \$0.50 to \$1.00 per kilometer.



Interpreter Services

Interpreter services are typically available through the clinics, either free of charge or at an additional cost. It's advisable to confirm this service with the clinic prior to your visit.



Payment Methods

- Payments can be made using cash or credit/debit cards.
- The local currency is the Turkish Lira (TRY), and it's recommended to have some for smaller expenses.
- Many vendors accept dollars or euros, but it's more cost-effective to pay in the local currency.



Before Your Lymphoma Treatment

- Consult with your local doctor to ensure you are fit for travel and treatment.
- Discuss your current medications with your Turkish medical team to avoid any contraindications.
- Arrange for health insurance that covers international treatment.
- Prepare a list of questions and concerns to discuss with your medical team in Turkey.
- Adhere to any pre-treatment instructions provided by your clinic, such as fasting or medication adjustments.
- Bring comfortable clothing suitable for post-treatment recovery.
- Inform your bank about international travel to avoid any issues with card usage.
- Ensure you have access to necessary funds for the treatment and additional expenses during your stay.
