Your Guide to Prepare for **Mole Removal Trip to** Germany



Documents and Visa Requirements

- Ensure you have a valid passport with at least six months remaining from the date of entry into Germany.
- Check visa requirements for Germany by visiting the Federal Foreign Office website or contacting the nearest German embassy, as requirements vary by country.
- Bring medical documents related to your mole history and any previous treatments or diagnostics. This includes pathology reports if
- German clinics may provide diagnostics and tests if you lack certain medical documents, but it's best to bring all available records to facilitate your treatment.



Accommodation Options

Accommodation is not included in the Mole Removal package. However, you can arrange your stay in Germany through:

- · Hospital stays, if necessary post-surgery, usually included in the medical fee.
- Partner hotels with discounts negotiated by the clinic or your medical coordinator.

• Self-booking options via online platforms such as Booking.com or Airbnb.

The average price for a hotel stay per night ranges from €50 to €150, depending on the location and standard of the hotel.



Transfer Services

- · Clinics in Germany typically do not offer free airport transfers. It is advisable to arrange this service in advance or upon arrival.
- Popular taxi services include Free Now, MyTaxi, and local taxi companies. The cost from the airport to the city center may vary from €25 to



Interpreter Services

Interpreter services are not typically free and should be arranged in advance if needed. The cost varies based on the language and duration of the service. Contact your medical coordinator for assistance in booking an interpreter.



Payment Methods

- · Payment for medical services can usually be made with cash or card.
- The local currency in Germany is the Euro (€). It's recommended to have local cash for small expenses, although credit/debit cards are
- Paying in dollars or euros is possible, but it's more convenient to use euros for all transactions.



Pre-Op Mole Removal Tips

- Avoid sun exposure and tanning treatments for at least two weeks before the procedure to prevent skin irritation.
- Do not apply any lotions, creams, or makeup on the area to be treated on the day of surgery.
- Inform your surgeon of any medications you are taking, as some may need to be stopped before the surgery.
- Eat a healthy meal the night before and drink plenty of water to stay hydrated.
- Arrange for someone to accompany you on the day of the procedure if possible.
- Wear comfortable, loose-fitting clothing on the day of your mole removal.
- All postoperative instructions will be provided by your mole removal doctor.
