Prepare for Your Pancreatic Cancer Treatment in Turkey



Documents and Visa Requirements

- · Valid passport and possibly a visa, depending on your country of origin. A tourist visa is often sufficient for medical travel.
- Check Turkey's visa requirements for your specific country at Turkey e-Visa or the nearest Turkish embassy.
- · Medical records detailing your pancreatic cancer diagnosis and any previous treatments.
- If certain medical documents are missing, Turkish clinics may provide diagnostic services such as PET/CT scans to complete your medical profile



Accommodation Options

Accommodation is not included in the treatment package, but you can arrange for a hospital stay of up to 14 days for certain treatments or use Bookimed's medical travel assistance to book hotel rooms at special partner prices. The average hotel stay per night may vary, typically ranging from \$50 to \$150. If you have an accompanying person, check with the clinic or hotel for their conditions and possible costs.



Transfer Services

- Clinics may offer free VIP transfers between the airport and the clinic.
- For additional travel, popular taxi services such as BiTaksi or iTaksi in major cities can be used, with prices starting from around 1.5 TRY/km.



Interpreter Services

Personal translators are available and usually included in the treatment package for non-Turkish speaking patients, ensuring clear communication with healthcare professionals.



Payment Methods

- · Payments can be made using cash or credit/debit cards.
- The local currency is the Turkish Lira (TRY), but it's often possible to pay in US dollars or euros, especially in medical facilities catering to international patients.




Before Your Pancreatic Cancer Treatment

- Gather all medical records and personal identification documents well in advance of your trip.
- Consult with your local doctor to ensure you're fit for travel and treatment.
- Discuss all medications you're currently taking with your Turkish medical team, as adjustments may be needed.
- Consider learning basic Turkish phrases or using a digital translator to facilitate everyday interactions.
- Adhere to any pre-treatment instructions provided by your Turkish medical team to ensure the best outcomes.
- Plan for recovery time post-treatment in Turkey and at home, including any necessary support.
- Ensure you have adequate travel insurance that covers medical treatment abroad.
- Stay in regular contact with your personal medical coordinator at Bookimed for any assistance.
