Documents and Visa Requirements

- Valid passport and possibly a visa depending on your country of origin. Check the Schengen Visa Info website for specific requirements.
- · Medical referral letter, detailed medical history, and prostate cancer diagnosis information.
- Previous biopsy reports, PSA test results, and any other relevant test results or imaging.
- · Clinics in Spain may provide additional diagnostics and tests if certain medical documents are lacking.

Accommodation Options

Accommodation is not included in the treatment package. Patients can choose from hospital stays, partner hotels with discounts, or self-booking options. Average hotel stay per night may range from €50 to €200. Conditions for the accompanying person are subject to the hotel's policy, and they may need to book a separate room.

Transfer Services

- Transfer services are not included but can be arranged through the clinic or third-party providers.
- Popular taxi services include Cabify and Radio Taxi, with approximate prices starting from €20 for a short trip within the city.

Interpreter Services

Interpreter services may be available upon request, usually for a fee. It is advisable to clarify this with the clinic before your trip.

Payment Methods

- · Payments are accepted via cash or credit card.
- The local currency is the Euro (EUR), and it is essential to have local currency for transactions.
- Paying in dollars or euros is generally possible, but local currency is recommended for smaller expenses and convenience.

Before Your Prostate Cancer Treatment

- Discuss all medications and supplements you are taking with your doctor, as some may need to be stopped before the procedure.
- Follow any fasting instructions provided before anesthesia, typically no food or drink after midnight the day of surgery.
- · Plan for post-treatment recovery, including time off work and assistance at home if necessary.
- Pack comfortable clothing and personal items, considering the length of your hospital stay.
- Ensure you have adequate health insurance coverage or funds for additional expenses that may arise.
- Prepare a list of questions or concerns to discuss with Prof. Raimon Miralbell or your medical team.
- Consider downloading translation apps or carrying a phrasebook if you are not comfortable with Spanish.
- Stay informed about the latest travel advisories and health guidelines related to COVID-19 for Spain.
