

Prepare for Your Prostate Cancer Treatment in Turkey



Documents and Visa Requirements

- Valid passport and/or national ID card for travel to Turkey.
- Visa requirements vary by country; check the latest information for your specific case at [Turkey's Electronic Visa Application System](#).
- Medical documents including health history, imaging, test results, and referral letters from your local doctor.
- Most clinics in Turkey can provide diagnostics and tests if you lack certain medical documents, but it is best to confirm this in advance.



Accommodation Options

Accommodation is not covered by the clinic. However, there are numerous options available, ranging from hospital stays for the duration of treatment to partner hotels offering special discounts for patients. Self-booking is also possible with average hotel prices starting from around \$50 per night. The conditions of stay for an accompanying person should be confirmed with the hotel or clinic.



Transfer Services

- Clinics may offer free airport transfers; confirm this service when arranging your treatment.
- Popular taxi services such as BiTaksi and iTaksi are available in major cities, with approximate prices starting at \$0.50 per km.



Interpreter Services

Interpreter services are often available through the clinic, sometimes at an additional cost. It's advisable to clarify the availability and fees of this service in advance to ensure smooth communication during your stay.



Payment Methods

- Payments can be made in cash or by card.
- The local currency is the Turkish Lira, and having local cash can be handy for smaller expenses.
- You may pay in dollars or euros at many places; however, it is advisable to have some local currency for convenience.



Before Your Prostate Cancer Treatment

- Discuss your current medications with your doctor to ensure they won't interfere with treatment.
- Maintain a healthy diet and stay hydrated before your trip.
- Arrange for someone to accompany you if possible, for support and assistance.
- Prepare a list of questions and concerns to discuss with your medical team in Turkey.
- Follow any preoperative instructions provided by your doctor, such as fasting before surgery.
- Pack comfortable clothing and personal items for your hospital stay.
- Ensure that you have adequate travel insurance that covers medical treatment abroad.
- Rest adequately before the trip to be in the best possible condition for your treatment.
