

Your Guide to Prepare for Sarcoma Treatment in Turkey



Documents and Visa Requirements

- Passport valid for at least six months beyond your stay and a visa or visa exemption depending on your country.
- Check visa requirements for Turkey based on your country of origin at [e-Visa](#) or the nearest Turkish consulate.
- Medical records detailing your sarcoma diagnosis, treatment history, and any allergies or medications.
- Clinics in Turkey may offer diagnostic tests and imaging, such as MRI or CT scans, if additional documentation is required.



Accommodation Options

Clinics often provide hospital stays for the duration of your treatment. Partner hotels may offer discounts, or you can choose self-booking options. Accommodation provision varies; some may be free, while others are fee-based. On average, hotel stays can range from \$50 to \$150 per night. Accompanying persons can typically stay with the patient or arrange nearby accommodations.



Transfer Services

- Many clinics offer complimentary airport transfers, while others may charge a fee.
- Popular taxi services like BiTaksi, Uber, or local taxis are available, with prices starting at approximately \$0.50 per km.



Interpreter Services

Interpreter services are often available, either free of charge or for a fee, to assist with language barriers during your medical journey in Turkey.



Payment Methods

- Cash and credit card payments are accepted.
- Local currency (Turkish Lira - TRY) is necessary for smaller expenses, although USD and EUR may be accepted in some places.



Before Your Sarcoma Treatment

- Consult with your local doctor about the treatment plan and any necessary medical preparation.
- Arrange for all medical records and diagnostic images to be available for your Turkish medical team.
- Discuss potential risks and recovery expectations with your Turkish treatment provider in advance.
- Ensure you have enough medication for the duration of your stay in Turkey, plus extra for unexpected delays.
- Establish a communication plan with your family and treatment provider in Turkey.
- Adhere to any preoperative instructions given by your Turkish medical team, such as fasting before surgery.
- Pack appropriately for the hospital stay and recovery period, including loose-fitting clothing and personal care items.
- Plan for post-treatment support in your home country, including follow-up appointments and rehabilitation services.
