Your Guide to Prepare for

Facelift Surgery Trip to

Poland



Documents and Visa Requirements

- Valid passport or travel document with at least three months' validity beyond the intended stay.
- Visa for non-EU citizens, where applicable check Poland's current visa requirements for your country at Poland's official travel website or embassy.
- Medical documents: referral from a GP, medical history, and any prior test results.
- · Clinics in Poland may provide additional diagnostics and tests if necessary medical documents are lacking.



Accommodation Options

While accommodation is not included, partner hotels like Accor Mercure Jelenia Góra offer superior rooms starting at €65/day with breakfast (double − €80/day). Hospital stays are in a two-bed ward during the procedure.



Transfer Services

- Transfer services are not included but can be arranged personal driver costs: 190€ from Wroclaw, 300€ from Prague, 170€ from Görlitz, and 475€ from Berlin Brandenburg.
- Popular local taxi services are available with varying prices; please inquire for details.



Interpreter Services

Interpreter services may be available upon request; the cost and availability will depend on the clinic's policies.



Payment Methods

- Cash and card payments are accepted.
- The local currency is the Polish Zloty (PLN), and it is recommended to have some on hand for minor expenses.
- Some establishments may accept Euros or Dollars, but it's more practical to use local currency.



Pre-Op Facelift Surgery Tips

- Follow any specific pre-operative instructions given by your surgeon or clinic.
- Stop smoking at least 2 weeks before surgery to improve recovery.
- Avoid taking aspirin, anti-inflammatory drugs, and herbal supplements as they can increase bleeding.
- Eat a healthy diet and stay hydrated in the days leading up to your surgery.
- Arrange for someone to drive you to and from the clinic and assist you for at least the first night post-op.
- Prepare your recovery area at home or hotel with essentials within easy reach.
- Plan to take at least 2 weeks off from work for recovery.
