

Prepare for Your Vaginoplasty Trip to Turkey



Documents and Visa Requirements

- Valid passport and return ticket are mandatory for international travel to Turkey.
- Visit the Turkish Ministry of Foreign Affairs website or check with your local Turkish consulate to understand visa requirements, as these vary by country: [Visa Information for Foreigners](#).
- Bring medical records related to your health history and any previous treatments.
- Clinics in Turkey may provide diagnostics and tests if certain medical documents are missing, usually at an additional cost.



Accommodation Options

Most clinics partner with local hotels to offer discounted rates for their patients. While some may provide free accommodation, it is not a standard practice, and you should verify with the clinic beforehand. Hospital stays are typically included in the procedure package. The average hotel stay per night ranges between \$50 and \$100, depending on the hotel's category and location.



Transfer Services

- Clinics often offer free airport transfers, but it's important to confirm this service when scheduling your procedure.
- Popular taxi services like BiTaksi and iTaksi operate in major Turkish cities, with average prices starting at around 1.5 TL per kilometer (approximately \$0.10 USD).



Interpreter Services

Interpreter services are available and can be arranged through your clinic, usually for a fee. Some clinics may include it as part of their package, so it's essential to inquire about this when planning your trip.



Payment Methods

- Clinics accept payments in cash and by card.
- Turkey's local currency is the Turkish Lira (TL), and having local cash is recommended for small expenses.
- Many places may accept dollars or euros, but it's advisable to have some local currency for convenience.



Pre-Op Vaginoplasty Tips

- Follow any preoperative instructions provided by your surgeon, such as fasting before the surgery.
- Arrange for someone to accompany you, if possible, for support during your recovery period.
- Consider staying near the clinic to minimize travel after the procedure.
- Bring comfortable, loose-fitting clothes for your postoperative comfort.
- Stay hydrated and maintain a healthy diet to aid in recovery.
- Prepare a list of questions or concerns to discuss with your surgeon during consultations.
- Inform your surgeon of any medications or supplements you are taking, as they may affect the surgery or recovery.
- Ensure you have a reliable means of communication with your medical team after the procedure.
